

Snow and Ice.

Our Village Environment Team has reviewed the current priority list and agreed with the Parish Council that we would look to take forward the route below as the only gritting route for our Community Workers.

- Right hand side of Halstead Road and the High Street coming from Halstead from the Baptist Church to the Primary School (this would take in the chemist, the Library and St Andrews and the butchers and Post Office)
- > Top of Massingham Drive down to the Dr's
- Queens Road car park around to the Lion (due to the camber and access to the Coop and parking), Queens Road to the zebra crossing at Fork 'Andles (as people coming down the safe side would need to cross to get to the Coop safely).

We will salt and grit and sweep loose snow as soon as we can get our team out to it.

We would keep the distribution of 2 bags of salt and grit to the village teams at the main community sites:-

- Rec Club
- Hillie Bunnies/Burrows Road (to start the pull round of grit by traffic onto Queens Road and the inclines)
- Drs
- School (we will ask again as this has not been taken up before)
- Con Club
- Rec Club
- Village Hall
- Baptist Church
- St Andrews

On the basis that they can start getting the salt and grit onto these main community areas.

We would look to place 2 bags with residents or at strategic places at these suggested further areas, again looking at known issue points and looking to aid access to the High Street:-

- 1. Homefield Way
- 2. Dudley Road/De Vere Road
- 3. Atlas Road onto Station Road
- 4. Morleys and the Kennels area
- 5. Swallowfields
- 6. Monks Road
- 7. **CALA**.
- 8. Tey Road area.

We will be finalising the areas with our volunteers and, once confirmed, we will put out exact locations.
